

BAPTISM OF FIRE

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And the sight of the glory of the LORD was like devouring fire on the top of the mount in the eyes of the children of Israel. Exodus 24:17

What are we going to appear like in this next move of God? What is God's outpouring going to look like upon us? What is the process we have been going through, or are going to have to go through for this change to manifest in us?

We can see from Ex 24:17 the Glory of the Lord is like a devouring fire. What does that look like when God's Glory rest upon us and not a mountain? What will we have to walk through in order for us to say, "I have awakened in His likeness."?

15 As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness. Psalm 17:15

God, who is a consuming fire, will be consuming something in us in order for us to be in His likeness. What will that be? Our flesh. Let's look at some scripture that discusses the flesh and what is going to be done to it as God begins to put His Glory fire upon us.

Jer 12:12 The spoilers are come upon all high places through the wilderness: for the sword of the LORD shall devour from the one end of the land even to the other end of the land: no flesh shall have peace.

One of the first things to go is our peace. What? That doesn't sound like a promise. As long as our flesh is being pampered it's at peace, but once the fire is put upon it and it doesn't get appeased the first thing to go is our peace. Why? Because it doesn't feel good. You can feel it when the fire is on you; the anger crawling up the back of your neck, the need to fight the circumstances and stand in our righteous position as you justify your situation before God. You may even be indignant with God that He has the audacity to let these things happen to you. After all, you are a child of God.

Mt 24:22 And except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be shortened.

What days are being shortened? The days of fire. God has to give us relief from the fire and our circumstances. If we are in them for too long without some kind of reprieve we'd want to go home to the Lord. Some of these refining circumstances can be very intense.

Ro 3:20 Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin.

God is moving us out of a place of being a child-heir into being a son. While you are a child you are still under the law, your under tutors and governors, Gal 4. Those tutors are the teachers, parents those that have been placed in your life for training and then governors are there to over see your provision like your natural job. All this is still Egypt-minded thinking and training. Let me explain briefly what I'm talking about by Egypt-minded thinking. When you are saved your spirit is quickened (brought to life), but your soul (mind, will and emotions) and your flesh and all it's carnal desires are still trained up in the ways of Egypt. You are still looking to man for your provision, your teaching, to make you feel good about yourself. You are still easily offended and moved by your emotions. God is still not your God yet, because you are looking to man (Moses) to be your interpreter and provider. The depth of full reliance upon God Himself and the knowledge of the ways of the Kingdom of God have not been embraced and understood.

This can be a long season or short. Some people having excepted Jesus as their savior have never moved into the place where Jesus has become their Lord. Our whole life we are trained in the kingdom of Mammon. We are told what it is to be successful in man's kingdom. This train of thought has infiltrated the church. When we interpret the Word of God without the Spirit of God we will always come out with the wrong interpretation. Why? Because our flesh will interpret the word to best suit it. Even when we are filled with the Holy Spirit, when our flesh has not yet be crucified; the interpretation of the Word will be skewed because it will be filtered by our flesh.

That's why we must enter into the wilderness to come into the next phase of our training with God. We go through the baptism of the water "Red Sea" as a symbol of crucifying the flesh, next are the experiences that will actually do this. We can complain against the training or yield and become meek before the Lord. Once you become a son there is no place for the law. We are fully submitted to the Lord and are living under the grace of God. Ultimately we have to be brought to the point that no flesh shall glory in His presence. God is our source, our provider, our provision, our Lord, our Master, our King and our God. He is the ultimate authority in our lives. We are fully submitted to Him and receive our instructions directly from Him. He is the Lord of Host. We are submitted to Him as a loyal member of His Kingdom.

1Co 1:29 That no flesh should glory in his presence.

What are the works of the flesh? Let's see, Galatians 5 gives us a good listing of the works of the flesh.

13 ¶ For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

14 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

15 But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.

16 This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

17 For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would.

18 But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.

(I have a teaching called “Being Sensitive to the Holy Spirit” if you want to know more about being led by the Spirit.)

19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness.

20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God. Gal 5

This is very serious. People continue to walk in the flesh and are deceived in believing they are somehow justified before God and are going to heaven. The scripture is very clear here. If you are operating in the works of the flesh you will NOT inherit the kingdom of God.

Ga 2:16 Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

We are justified by faith and not by works. We have to go through the fire in order to develop our faith so we can be justified by the faith of Christ in us.

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

24 And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. Gal 5:22-24

God allows the fire to come in our lives to reveal to us what is really there. There can be some pretty ugly stuff. Areas where we think we trust God, we find, we really don't. We have to come to the place of Meekness before God. The Lord told me His definition of Meekness. Do you want to know what He said? He said, “Meekness before Me is that you recognize I'm in charge of everything, and you can do nothing without me.” If this statement gets any kind of rise in you I guarantee there is some “self” flesh in there. We are to be completely and totally submitted to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in ALL areas of our life, not just the areas we decide.

In the old testament people who had a plague in their skin had to show themselves to the priest and they had to bring their garments to the priest once they were healed to make sure the plague wasn't in their garment. They had a whole bunch of rituals for cleansing an individual, their clothes, where they sat, their beds and even their homes if there was some kind of mold or plague growing in it. They had to be separated, then inspected, give sacrifices and burn infected objects...all kinds of things had to be done

to purify the flesh.

51 And he shall look on the plague on the seventh day: if the plague be spread in the garment, either in the warp, or in the woof, or in a skin, or in any work that is made of skin; the plague is a fretting leprosy; it is unclean.

52 He shall therefore burn that garment, whether warp or woof, in woollen or in linen, or any thing of skin, wherein the plague is: for it is a fretting leprosy; it shall be burnt in the fire.

53 And if the priest shall look, and, behold, the plague be not spread in the garment, either in the warp, or in the woof, or in any thing of skin;

54 Then the priest shall command that they wash the thing wherein the plague is, and he shall shut it up seven days more:

55 And the priest shall look on the plague, after that it is washed: and, behold, if the plague have not changed his colour, and the plague be not spread; it is unclean; thou shalt burn it in the fire; it is fret inward, whether it be bare within or without.

56 And if the priest look, and, behold, the plague be somewhat dark after the washing of it; then he shall rend it out of the garment, or out of the skin, or out of the warp, or out of the woof:

57 And if it appear still in the garment, either in the warp, or in the woof, or in any thing of skin; it is a spreading plague: thou shalt burn that wherein the plague is with fire.

58 And the garment, either warp, or woof, or whatsoever thing of skin it be, which thou shalt wash, if the plague be departed from them, then it shall be washed the second time, and shall be clean. Lev 13:51-57 (Garment spotted by the flesh teaching)

If garment couldn't be cleansed by washing it had to be burned. If it looked like change is taking place the garment gets washed a second time. What do our garments look like?

11 And ye came near and stood under the mountain; and the mountain burned with fire unto the midst of heaven, with darkness, clouds, and thick darkness.

12 And the LORD spake unto you out of the midst of the fire: ye heard the voice of the words, but saw no similitude; only ye heard a voice. Duet 4:11-12

The Lord speaks out of the midst of the fire. Are you in the fire? God will speak to you there. He will be there with us in the midst of the fire as well.

1 ¶ Now when Solomon had made an end of praying, the fire came down from heaven, and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the LORD filled the house.

2 And the priests could not enter into the house of the LORD, because the glory of the LORD had filled the LORD'S house. 2Chronicles 7:1

When we pray and lay our flesh on the altar God's fire will consume the offering and fill our temple with His Glory.

10 For thou, O God, hast proved us: thou hast tried us, as silver is tried.

11 Thou broughtest us into the net; thou laidst affliction upon our loins.

12 Thou hast caused men to ride over our heads; we went through fire and through water: but thou broughtest us out into a wealthy place.

13 I will go into thy house with burnt offerings: I will pay thee my vows, Psalm 66:10-13

God allows testing and trials to come. He allows affliction to come upon our flesh and our lives. He allows people to run us over. But after this testing of fire has come upon our lives; which He brings us through, we come into a wealthy place in His Kingdom and before Him. No flesh shall glory in His presence. To have the honor of coming before our God, all our flesh nature must die.

Who maketh his angels spirits; his ministers a flaming fire: Psalm 104:4

These trials are to make us like Him, even as flames of fire.

3 And it shall come to pass, that he that is left in Zion, and he that remaineth in Jerusalem, shall be called holy, even every one that is written among the living in Jerusalem:

4 When the Lord shall have washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and shall have purged the blood of Jerusalem from the midst thereof by the spirit of judgment, and by the spirit of burning.

5 And the LORD will create upon every dwelling place of mount Zion, and upon her assemblies, a cloud and smoke by day, and the shining of a flaming fire by night: for upon all the glory shall be a defence. Is 4:3-5

God must take away our filth. He uses the spirit of judgment; which are the curses starting in Deuteronomy 28:15 and the fire. He does this so that we will be called Holy. Then He will cover us with His smoke and fire and His glory shall be our defence. I know you may not think God would let His curses come upon us, but who were the curses upon? They were for the children of Israel, not those outside of the covenant. If you don't think He does that, look at what you're going through and see if it lines up with any of the curses. If you've ever worked with children or anyone for that matter; you place choices before them to develop their behavior in the proper direction. If you choose A it comes with this set of consequences and if you choose B this set. Your leaving the choice up to the individual, they get the results they choose by their actions. That's what God did with us, choose A get the blessings, choose B get the cursings. It's simple. I can hear you saying, but I'm a child of God, I didn't bring these things upon me. I didn't choose this. O.K., did Job choose His trial. God said there was none like His servant Job. Look what God allowed in His life just so He could get to the self-righteousness that was hidden in his heart. There are presumptuous sins and there are sins of omission. There are hidden things in our hearts and attitudes that unless God kicks up the fire, they won't come to the service so He can scoop them out of us. Look at Psalm 38 the whole psalm is dealing with sin and the things we go through because of it.

O LORD, rebuke me not in thy wrath: neither chasten me in thy hot displeasure.

2 For thine arrows stick fast in me, and thy hand presseth me sore.

3 There is no soundness in my flesh because of thine anger; neither is there any rest in my bones because of my sin.

4 For mine iniquities are gone over mine head: as an heavy burden they are too heavy for me.

5 My wounds stink and are corrupt because of my foolishness.

6 I am troubled; I am bowed down greatly; I go mourning all the day long.

7 For my loins are filled with a loathsome disease: and there is no soundness in my flesh.

8 I am feeble and sore broken: I have roared by reason of the disquietness of my heart. Psalm 38

No question about it. God was dealing with David and his soul and flesh in this psalm, just like He deals with ours. The question is, will we humble ourselves before the Lord and acknowledge it as sin before the Father so He can remove it from us? As long as we justify what we do or won't do God will continue the fire until we yield.

12 Who can understand his errors? cleanse thou me from secret faults.

God has to let His fire come to reveal these secret faults. These are things we don't even know we do that are sin.

13 Keep back thy servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me: then shall I be upright, and I shall be innocent from the great transgression.

Do you see this? These sins will rule us unless God's fire purges them from us. We must pray as David prayed in verse 14.

14 Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O LORD, my strength, and my redeemer. Psalm 19:12-14

Peter goes on to say that these people are selfwilled and despise "God's" government. They don't have a problem running their mouth. Have you ever spoke bad about a decision a leader in God's government made concerning you? Have you ever spoke bad about your boss, your parents, your teacher, your president? Now can you see the need for the fire? We move in this stuff so easily unless the Lord brings it to our attention.

10 ¶ But chiefly them that walk after the flesh in the lust of uncleanness, and despise government. Presumptuous are they, selfwilled, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities. 2Peter 2:10

16 Therefore shall the Lord, the Lord of hosts, send among his fat ones leanness; and under his glory he shall kindle a burning like the burning of a fire.

Here the Lord says He's going to send leanness on His fat ones, healthy ones. He is going to use His fire to do it.

17 And the light of Israel shall be for a fire, and his Holy One for a flame: and it shall burn and devour his thorns and his briers in one day;

He's going to burn away everything that is not of Him; thorns and briers.

18 And shall consume the glory of his forest, and of his fruitful field, both soul and body: and they shall be as when a standardbearer fainteth.

He is going to consume everything that is of self, all the works of the flesh; soul and body. Until we yield in those areas and faint; which means I give up rights and yield to the Master. When a person faints in the natural they just fall to the ground. When we fall to the ground and faint it is an act of Worship to God. Our spirit received salvation but our soul and body also must receive the full salvation granted to us through Jesus' sacrifice.

19 And the rest of the trees of his forest shall be few, that a child may write them.

By the time He finishes with the fire, only a few will remained to receive the full salvation provided. There will only be a remnant.

20 ¶ And it shall come to pass in that day, that the remnant of Israel, and such as are escaped of the house of Jacob, shall no more again stay upon him that smote them; but shall stay upon the LORD, the Holy One of Israel, in truth.

21 The remnant shall return, even the remnant of Jacob, unto the mighty God.

22 For though thy people Israel be as the sand of the sea, yet a remnant of them shall return: the consumption decreed shall overflow with righteousness. Is 10

When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee. Is 43:2

When we are growing in our faith there will be trials and afflictions sent to us to grow us up in the things of the Kingdom. God gives us these promises that He will be with us as we go through these

trials; baptism of waters and of fire.

He answered and said, Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God. Dan 3:25

I want you to see that these were men of God in the fire. Often people wonder why they are going through the fire when they are trying so hard to be before God and keep His commandments. Religion will tell you, you must have done something wrong. Just the opposite is true. It is because you are walking righteously before God that you go through these trials. They come for the purpose of creating Christ-likeness in us. It is a privilege to be chosen of God to go through these things. As you can also see God walks in the midst of the fire with us.

9 ¶ I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, whose garment was white as snow, and the hair of his head like the pure wool: his throne was like the fiery flame, and his wheels as burning fire.

10 A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened. Dan 7:9

If you were still having doubts about where the fire comes from look at Daniel 7: 9 -10 we read in Is 43:2 that when we pass the river, the flood and the fire God would be with us; however, Dan 7:9 shows us He IS the fiery stream and the fire.

18 And the house of Jacob shall be a fire, and the house of Joseph a flame, and the house of Esau for stubble, and they shall kindle in them, and devour them; and there shall not be any remaining of the house of Esau; for the LORD hath spoken it. Ob 1:18

There will not be anything left of the flesh when God is done. Esau gave up his birthright to feed his flesh. God will use those around us to burn up our flesh.

And I will bring the third part through the fire, and will refine them as silver is refined, and will try them as gold is tried: they shall call on my name, and I will hear them: I will say, It is my people: and they shall say, The LORD is my God. Zec 13:9

Here again we see that God is going to refine His remnant with fire. It is necessary for us to go through this so we can walk as Jesus walked.

11 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire:

12 Whose fan is in his hand, and he will throughly purge his floor, and gather his wheat into the

garner; but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire. Mttw3:11

Once the fire starts, it can't be put out, it's and unquenchable fire. We can't just quit in the middle of it. It is something we all must go through if we want to walk in the fullness of Christ.

49 For every one shall be salted with fire, and every sacrifice shall be salted with salt.

50 Salt is good: but if the salt have lost his saltness, wherewith will ye season it? Have salt in yourselves, and have peace one with another. Mark 9:49

This is pretty interesting. I never saw this before until I did this study. You can't be salty until you go through the fire. There are plenty of teachings about being salty, but not too many that tell you what you have to go through to get that way.

3 And when Paul had gathered a bundle of sticks, and laid them on the fire, there came a viper out of the heat, and fastened on his hand. Acts 28:3

How many times have you seen the vipers come out of you when the fire gets turned up? It's like you're getting squeezed on a press and what's in there has to jump out and grab you. It's not very pleasant but we can take and shake it off and throw it back into the fire where it belongs.

If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire. 1 Cor 3:15

By now you should be getting the idea that if you are Christ' you are going to go through the fire. It's real easy to just skim over all these scriptures not really having a paradigm to place with these things. Well let me help you put into practical everyday life what the fire may appear like.

You lose your job and you don't know how you're going to pay your bills.

You have suddenly have anxiety attacks because you don't know how you're going to live.

Your child is getting in trouble doing drugs, going to jail....

Someone close to you just died and you don't know what you're going to do.

You've been served foreclosure notice on your house.

The tow truck came to get your vehicle.

Your spouse has cheated on you and has left you for another person.

You had all your money in a 401k and suddenly it's worthless.

A flood came and wrecked your home.

You don't have money to buy food.

Someone you know or you; is suddenly diagnosed with a major disease or life-threatening condition.
You have chronic pain you just can't get rid of.
Appears as though all your "friends" have turned against you.
You get arrested for preaching the gospel.
You get thrown in jail for delivering someone of a demon.
The list is endless....

GOOD NEWS! If you are going through "something" you are going through the FIRE. You have been qualified for the next level of God's Kingdom. Whooo-Hooo! Give a shout of Praise! No, I'm not nuts. Really, even though it doesn't appear to your flesh to be a good thing, it is a good thing if you can come out on the other side. Unfortunately, people get stuck in the wilderness of their "fire" experience and don't make it. But Jesus said to be encouraged because He has already overcome and if He dwells in you, that means, you have overcome too.

33 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world. John 16:33

The biggest and most difficult obstacle to overcome in the fire is YOU. This is where we must learn to trust and have faith in God and His word; even more specifically, what He has told you personally He will do.

The flesh has to die, your soul has to release control unto God and accept His Lordship in all areas of your life. I know this is hard to believe, but God doesn't care about the circumstances we are in. He cares about the results. God knows exactly what it will take in each of our lives to get the right results. We have custom orchestrated circumstances, courtesy of the Most High. Please don't misunderstand me. He does care about each of us. He cares about what we are going through to the degree we are pressing into Him and looking to Him for the answer. Ultimately we are being prepared to reign with Him through eternity; this is part of the training process.

Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations: (this means more than one)

7 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ: Look at this, Jesus Christ is going to appear in us. When He does He receives praise, honor and glory. How awesome is that!

8 Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory:

9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls. 1Peter 1:7-9

I can tell you, Peter went through the fire. Until I went through the fire (which I'm not saying I'm

done) I had no concept of what he was really saying here. I can tell you this, when the fire starts you find out what's really inside of you. Do you have the Word of God in you when the fire starts? What's coming out of you? Fear? Doubt? Unbelief? Faith? Trust? God's promises? What do you run to? Who do you run to? Pills, drugs or alcohol or God?

The only way you can make it through the fire is to grab a hold of God and His word and don't let go! Don't look at the circumstances, look at God. Keep your eyes fixed on the Lord and His Word. Have you ever tried to get a child's attention and then keep looking away? What do you do? You stand in front of them, get at their level and basically command them to look you in the eyes to know you have their attention. God's doing the same thing with us. You cannot allow yourself to be moved by circumstances no matter how bad they are. If you have a promise from God you must stand being fixed and un-moveable to see it manifest. One of the major victories you will achieve in the midst of the fire is peace in your circumstances. That's when you know you have entered into a place of rest where you trust God with what you are going through. Sometimes we go through a long season of testing and training or we may go through a lot of little mini fires. Best way through them is to ask the Lord what you are suppose to be learning in that season and learn it quick; give to Him what He's trying to get in you and then keep moving forward.

I can tell you it is completely different to stand with someone who is going through the fire than to be the one that is in the fire. God will let the fire burn until there is no more fuel for the fire; which happens to be our flesh. He wants it all. Burnt flesh is a sweet smelling savour unto the Lord.

9 And the priest shall take from the meat offering a memorial thereof, and shall burn it upon the altar: it is an offering made by fire, of a sweet savour unto the LORD.

10 And that which is left of the meat offering shall be Aaron's and his sons': it is a thing most holy of the offerings of the LORD made by fire. Lev 2:9

Ultimately He wants us to make us His ministers; which He says are as flames of fire.

7 And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels spirits, and his ministers a flame of fire. Hebrews 1:7

18 I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see.

19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

20 Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me. Rev 3:18-20

The gold we buy in the fire is us purified. That we may be rich, remember Psalm 66:12 says that He brought us into a wealthy place. *12 Thou hast caused men to ride over our heads; we went through*

fire and through water: but thou broughtest us out into a wealthy place. These are spiritual places in God. God says the poor in spirit shall see God. Once we see God we are truly rich! Our garment will no longer be spotted or expose the flesh. We'll have new white clothes. We'll be properly covered in God's Glory, no longer naked. We will have softened our eyes with God's oil so we will see as Jesus sees through His eyes of love.

*14 His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow; and his eyes were as a flame of fire:
Rev 1:14*

When Jesus looks upon His beloved He's looking at her with fire in His eyes. Hopefully we'll be looking back at Him with the same fire.

Let's pray:

Father God, I ask for you to impart to each one reading this, the revelation understanding of their current circumstances. That you will reveal to them the things you are after in this season of fire. I ask you for Great Grace and endurance to see this trial through in your faith and strength. I ask you Father to give each one, courage to stand in faith against their circumstances. Strengthen each one in the inner man. Help them to press into you and the deep things that you have for them. I pray Father that your perfect work would be done in them, that they would be entire and lacking nothing. That Christ would be formed and when they awake into the fullness of who you have created them to be they will behold your likeness. Lord, I bless them in Jesus mighty name. Amen.

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
